Huskers win title

Women's cross-country takes the day

Last weekend the women's crosscountry team proved why it is the No. 4-ranked team in the country when it came from behind to win the Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo Invitational.

The Cornhuskers were behind at the two-mile mark when Laura Wight and Sammie Resh moved up from 14 and 16th place to seventh and eighth, Coach Jay Dirksen said.

The Huskers won the meet with 66 points, while Cal Poly (SLO) finished a close second with 70. UCLA finished

fourth with 86.

Dirksen said what hurt the Huskers most was the absence of senior Jill Noel, who was out with a foot injury. He said the team lost 20 points because Noel didn't run.

Without Noel the Huskers still ran well. Dirksen said Nebraska had three of their seven runners finish in the top 20. The Huskers had runners finish 22nd and 26th, while Cal Poly's runners finished first, 10th, 11th, 19th and 25th.

"This was the best the girls have run all season," Dirksen said. "Every week

> The men's team last weekend competed at the Razorback Invitational in Fayetteville, Ark., against the No. 1 team in the nation, Arkansas. The Huskers finished third with 86 points, behind the Arkansas Alumni with 32 points, only three points behind the

Razorbacks' 29 points.

The top finisher for the Huskers was junior Jean Verster. Verster finished 11th. Dirksen said the reason Verster finished 11th was because he went out too fast at the start of the race.

Dirksen said the men's team is running very well and could finish as high as third in the Big Eight. Last year, Nebraska finished fifth. Dirksen said it will be tough for the men's team to finish among the top two of the conference because both Iowa State and Colorado have strong teams.

Nebraska had three runners finish in Dirksen said.

the top 20 at Arkansas, Junior colege transfer Jodi Fisher finished 16th, and Craig Vanderbeek finished 20th.

"Arkansas has a great team and will probably win the national championship. I don't see anybody beating them," Dirksen said. "But it was a good experience for our runners to run against that tough of competition."
