Mrs. Gold was born in Philadelphia and lived in Lincoln for 62 years. Before her death in February 1985, she established in her husband's name two endowed memorial funds in the NU Foundation. Those funds are the \$25,000 Nathan J. Gold Doctoral Research Fund in Marketing and a \$102,000 Nathan J. Gold Distinguished Professorship in Marketing, both in the UNL College of Nebraskans to the broad scope of art Business Administration.


