Nebraska's Shauna Gilmore was also a double winner in the meet as she captured both the 100- and 200-meter freestyle. No team scoring was kept in the meet.

"We knew when we went into the meet we had a good team," Huppert said Sunday. "After seeing us compete, we feel we have a really good team."

Huppert said one area which concerned him throughout the two-day meet was the level of anxiety displayed by some of the Cornhuskers' younger swimmers.

Because it was their first meet at the collegiate level, Huppert said, some of Nebraska's freshmen were extremely nervous before they swam.

"They don't need to dwell mentally before they swim," Huppert said. "If they do, they might drain themselves."

Huppert said from what he saw of the three remaining Big Eight schools competing in the meet, his early expectations of a tough race for the confer-

ence crown were realized.


