Soulful' show starts soon

Exhibit reflects world in images of hope, numbress, ecstasy

In response to the resurgence of interest in the figure in recent art, Joslyn Art Museum is showing "Body and Soul: Aspects of Recent Figurative Sculpture." The exhibition opens to the public Saturday and continues through March 8 at Joslyn.

The exhibition of sculpture by premier artists is a three-dimensional counterpart to the growing number of shows by figurative painters that have recently dominated galleries and the national press.

Organized by the Contemporary Arts Center in Cincinnati, "Body and Soul" is traveling under the auspices of the Art Museum Association of America. Joslyn is the second to last stop on the show's national tour, which began last February.

"Body and Soul" explores some of the major styles and themes in recent figurative sculpture. The work is ultimately a reflection of our world, a direct expression of aesthetic, political, social, individual, physical and emotional selves. There are images of hope, despair, numbness and ecstasy. There are heroes, victims, survivors and witnesses.

In the exhibition catalogue, Contemporary Arts Center curator Sarah Rogers-Lafferty writes that the show affirms man's continued motivation and need "to create symbols that describe, explain and memorialize himself." While the ancient Greeks glorified human perfection, Rogers-Lafferty writes, "contemporary artists herald man's strength by exposing our beauty and dignity in the face of our imperfections and vulnerabilities. Body and soul are still intimately intertwined, but in a more honest and Nancy Bowen and Genna Watson. questioning relationship."

"Body and Soul" presents works by 31 American artists. Featured are some of the most powerful figurative sculptures being created in this country today by such internationally renowned talents as George Segal, Jim Dine, Louis Bourgeois, Lucas Samaras and Marisol and by such spirited emerging artists as Mac Adams, John Ahearn,
