# Speaker: extremists rejected by farmers

Most Nebraska farmers blame themselves if they have financial troubles and resist recruiting efforts of extremist groups that blame government and the international banking community for the farm depression, said a UNL professor Monday at a seminar in the East Union.

Arthur Kirk, the Cairo farmer who was shot by state patrolmen in a standoff over fore closure papers, is now seen as a martyr to some extremists, Kay said.

Thirty percent of the farmers interviewed last summer claimed they were in financial distress, and 70 percent said they were "OK or prospering," Kay
