Magic Theatre to air 'Future Soap,' a fictional tale of life tomorrow

The Magic Theatre will open a new science-fictionplay, "Future Soap," on May 1. "Future Soap," written by 1987-88 Rockefeller Fellowship winner Megan Terry, will have original music by Omahans Bill Farber, Frank Fong, Mark Nelson and Eric Goolsby. It is directed by Gerald Ostdiek.

"Future Soap" is the second offering in the Magic Theatre's program of sharing with audiences some of the wealth of new workds created in the '60s that changed the face of the American theater. Terry's "Future Soap" was produced on National Educational Television in

1968 and 1969.

All performances begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be played Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights - May 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 17 and 18.
