All-campus events are scheduled for Friday and Saturday. All-night movies are scheduled for Friday at 9 p.m. in each hall's cafeteria.

Light said that the films are rented from Films, Inc., and they are the most expensive event for the week. She said the movies were rented for \$1,000 and are films that have run in theaters.

KFRX radio will sponsor a dance Saturday night, Light said. She said that the dance won't cost the Residence Hall Association anything be-cause it serves as free advertising for

Besides planned activities, Light said, FINK Week is a time for freshmen, transfer students and new hall residents to become acquainted with the university and the campus, and to create a community atmosphere in the residence halls.

FINKs will greet students and help them move in and will try to make the new surroundings seem as friendly as possible, Light said.

"When a new person on the floor knows at least one other person, they're not so alone," said Deb Richardson, a FINK on Schramm 5 last year.

Richardson said that even though she didn't receive a salary for her efforts, she enjoyed meeting new people and making new friends and

The signed contract includes 17 pages of detailed descriptions of parking arrangements, protection to the stadium's artificial turf, bans against political activity, and arrangements for covering UNL's cost.
