"I haven't said one way or another whether she could play or not," Pettit said. "It's not like she's playing a pick-up game of basketball or football.


Novak said playing badminton has helped her volleyball game.

when we rotate like that any number of us can play. I really don't like it, but I don't have any say so because of the type of position I'm in, because I've been hurt."

Hawkins and Sheppard gave opposing critiques of their play this sea-

"Overall, I'm pleased with my performance," Hawkins said. "I'm not happy at all," Sheppard said. "I'm kind of disappointed in the way my knee has come along, because I thought that I'd recover a lot faster than I have." The surprise of the wingbacks has been Bell, Brown said. Bell is a 6-foot, 195-pound redshirt sophomore from Altadena, Calif.

"Richard Bell has really made a good move," Brown said. "He's an extremely good runner and his pass receiving is improving. He has a great feel when he catches the ball and is a tough blocker. He is probably the biggest and the strongest of the wingbacks."

"We're a run-oriented team, so of course we're going to start off with the run, but if it comes down to it, we will pass," Brinson said. "We have a balanced attack.'

But the Cornhuskers' main concern is winning the national championship, Hawkins said.

"First we've got to win the Big Eight," he said. "That's our numberone goal, and then from there we go on and try to win the championship."

Besides playing wingback, Brinson and Sheppard also work with the special teams. Sheppard has not returned a punt or kickoff this season, but said that now that his knee is feeling better, he'd like to.


