## Foreign film series to show 11 movies

The University Program Council's Foreign Film Series of-fers a variety of films this year.

Jim Arthur, chairperson of the series, said the films will include a documentary and 11 commercial films - five comedies and art films like "Caravaggio," which chronicles the life of Michelangelo.


