

Foreign film series to show 11 movies

The University Program Council's Foreign Film Series offers a variety of films this year.

Jim Arthur, chairperson of the series, said the films will include a documentary and 11 commercial films — five comedies and art films like "Caravaggio," which chronicles the life of Michelangelo.

Arthur said the organization doesn't have a lot of information on the films, which makes it difficult to get any information to the public.

He said the Foreign Film Series is one of the oldest student-oriented activities at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The series has shown "inspirational films from other countries" for the last 3 1/2 decades, he said.

The committee adopted a new group-rate policy that will offer a 25 percent discount for groups of 10 or more. A list of all the members in a group should be left with

the committee adviser or chairperson in the UPC office, Nebraska Union 200.

The films for 1987-1988 include:

Oct. 18: "Marathon Family," from Yugoslavia.

Nov. 1: "Package Tour," from Hungary.

Nov. 15: "Sacrificed Youth," from China.

Dec. 6: "No End," from Poland.

Jan. 31: "Caravaggio," from Great Britain.

Feb. 14: "The Crazy Family," from Japan.

Feb. 28: "Faces of Women," from the Ivory Coast.

March 13: "The Assault," from Holland.

April 3: "Summer," from France.

April 17: "Kaos," from Italy. Admission is \$3.75 for the general public and \$2.75 for students. Group rates are available for everyone. A season pass is \$20, \$15 for students.

'Nightingale' opens at UNO

Life-size puppets, imagery and fairy tales are among the components that create "The Nightingale," the opening play in "Season of Visions," the University of Nebraska at Omaha's department of dramatic arts 1987-88 season.

"The Nightingale" will be performed Friday through Sunday and Oct. 16-18. All performances begin at 8 p.m. and will be in the University Theatre on the lower level of UNO's Arts and Sciences Hall.

"The play combines masks, puppets, music and movement in a unique and total theater experience," said Dr. Cindy Melby Phaneuf, director of "The Nightingale."

"The play is an adult fairy tale that deals with the differences between real and artificial values, and our obsession to possess the newest and finest. The play originated from Hans

Christian Andersen's fairy tale by the same name."

"Season of Vision" tickets are \$15 per person general admission, \$12 for students and senior citizens, and \$15 for UNO faculty and staff (the ticket

includes four tickets for each performance). Individual tickets for each performance will be \$4 for students and faculty, and \$5 for general admission. The Oct. 16 performance is sold out.

Profs take stage for recitals

Pianist Marsha Johnson and violinist Candida Wiley will perform as part of the University of Nebraska at Omaha's Faculty Recital Series on Friday, Oct. 9 at 8 p.m. in the Strauss Performing Arts Center Recital Hall.

The recital focuses on a number of major and diverse works for violin and piano, including Stravinsky's Suite Italienne, Beethoven's Sonata, Opus 12, Ravel's Sonata and Prokofiev's Sonata, Opus 94.

Johnson, a UNO faculty member and Omaha Symphony member, earned degrees in piano performance

from Northern Arizona University and the University of Iowa.

Wiley earned a graduate degree in performance from Indiana University and studied further in Spain and Switzerland. She has been a member of the Omaha Symphony Orchestra for the last four years and recently accepted the position of assistant concertmaster of the Tulsa Symphony Orchestra.

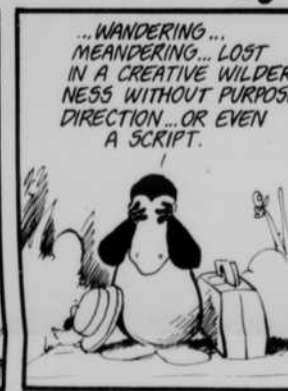
General admission is \$3, and tickets for students and senior citizens are \$2. UNO students with a student ID will be admitted free.
