Opera honors 4

Four anniversaries will be celebrated Saturday when the Texaco/Metropolitan Opera Radio Network opens its new season with a special prelude, including excerpts from this year's new productions, "Il Trovatore," "Das Rheingold" and "Siegfried."

The 1 p.m. broadcast can be heard on KRNU (90.3 FM), the radio station of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

The four-hour broadcast will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the birth of Lotte Lehmann, the 50th anniversary of Zinka Milanov's debut at the Met, the 25th anniversary of the first performance of Richard Strauss' "Ariadne auf Naxos" and the 50th anniversary of live broadcasts from the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. Included in Saturday's broad-

cast will be excerpts from past performances of "Il Trovatore" featuring the voices of Leontyne Price, Zinka Milanov, Bruce Castagna, Carlo Bergonzi and Jussi Bjoerling. Joan Sutherland and Luciano Pavarotti, who are to appear in this year's "Il Trovatore," will perform pieces from "La Sonnambula" and "Ernani." Excerpts from past performances of "Das Rheingold" and "Siegfried" will feature Kirsten Flagstad, Lauritz Melchior and Friedrich Schorr.
