
We've felt all year that we could match up better against Iowa State than with the rest of the conference," he said. "That included Missouri. We were more worried about them.

## Racial remarks end 'The Greek's' career

NEW YORK (AP) - Jimmy "The Greek" Snyder, the self-styled oddsmaker and expert on sports, was fired as a CBS Sports commentator Saturday, a day after making controversial remarks about blacks.

Snyder, 70, who had been with CBS for 12 years, said in a television interview that black athletes were superior to whites because during the Civil War "the slave owner would breed his big black with his big woman so that she would have a big black kid. That's where it all started.


