

Baseball team opens its season Saturday

Pratt says team may score many runs

Nebraska's baseball team begins a 69-game regular-season schedule this weekend, and the statistics indicate the Cornhuskers' season-opening contest against Wyoming should produce a lot of runs.

But Nebraska pitching coach Tom Pratt suggested otherwise.

"They could score a lot of runs because they are a good hitting team," Pratt said. "But I have confidence in our pitching staff that we can hold them down. We got enough talent, they're hungry and they're experienced."

"We don't want to get off to a bad start."

The Huskers will face Wyoming in a double-header starting at noon Saturday at Buck Beltzer Field. The teams will play a nine-inning game followed by a seven-inning contest. Sunday at noon, the teams will play another nine-inning game.

Wyoming, a member of the Western Athletic Conference, returns seven starters from last year's 27-22 team that averaged almost nine runs per game and batted .321 on the

season. The Cowboys' problems last year stemmed mainly from a pitching staff that gave up nearly six runs per game, Coach Bill Kinneberg said.

"That's a problem, sure," Kinneberg said. "We're playing at 7,000 feet (above sea level) and that's going to inflate the earned run average. We're not a great pitching team, but we're not a bad pitching team."

Wyoming's pitchers will face a Nebraska team that batted .317 last year and scored nine runs per game. The Huskers, who finished third in

the Big Eight last year, outscored opponents 488-351 while compiling a 36-21 record.

Kinneberg said Wyoming's first practice outside won't be until Friday, when the Cowboys work out in Lincoln. Being confined to practicing indoors could hurt the Cowboys offensively, he said.

"It's going to have an effect on us," Kinneberg said. "Hopefully, we prepared as well as we can indoors. We haven't faced any live-game situations, but we face that every year." Nebraska coach John Sanders said

the Cowboys will be prepared despite only working out indoors. The Huskers have practiced outside all week and about seven times total during the pre-season.

"I think they're (the Cowboys) very well-coached," Sanders said. "They'll come in prepared and be very competitive."

Sanders hasn't decided on a pitching rotation for the weekend's series. Kinneberg said the Cowboys will start junior Travis Teegarden and senior left-hander Randy Hayes Saturday. He said either senior right-hander Mike Heines or freshman Scott Freeman will get the nod Sunday.

INTERNSHIP JUNIOR HIGH TEACHER PREPARATION PROJECT

LINCOLN PUBLIC SCHOOLS/UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA-LINCOLN
A fifth year internship experience is being offered for people specifically interested in teaching in the junior high. This is a unique experience designed to provide support between the student teaching practicum and a full-time teaching position. The internship is part of a collaborative project between the Lincoln Public Schools and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Teachers College. This internship is a full year's experience, combining a half-time teaching assignment in a junior high with a half-time graduate studies component. A stipend will be paid for teaching three classes in a junior high in Lincoln. Nine hours of graduate credit per semester may be earned from UN-L. Completion of the internship may lead to a middle school endorsement. Students who will have graduated by August, 1988 and have applied for both a teaching certificate and intend to see admission to a graduate program are eligible to apply for an internship.
