The Ag Men, who tallied 117 team and 40 all-university points to win the championship, relied on the firstplace finishes of Arlan Paxton in the 200-meter dash and Steve Williams in the 800-meter run and the 1,600meter relay team of Allen George, Shawn Meyer, Jeff Hanson and Curt Thighs.

Alpha Tau Omega, which finished with 44 team and 36 all-university points, was aided by Tim Elsner, who finished second to Williams in the 800-meter run. Alpha Tau Omega's 1,600-meter relay team also earned a second-place finish.


