

Donahue says win boosts UCLA program

rolled over and started for the end zone. The Bruins thought Blazek was down and a whistle had blown. The officials conferred about the call and ruled Blazek scored.

UCLA struck back by taking the ensuing kickoff and marching 74 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown. An Aikman pass to split end David Keating gave the Bruins a 35-7 lead

with 6:35 left in the half.

Nebraska's first play of its next drive resulted in a Taylor pass being picked off by Turner. The Bruins capitalized on the turnover by moving 23 yards in six plays, with place kicker Alfredo Velasco kicking a 42-yard field goal.

The Nebraska offense scored its first touchdown with 1:14 left in the half. Nebraska took the kickoff and marched 74 yards in 10 plays, with

Taylor hitting Gregory with a touchdown pass. Chris Drennan's point after attempt was no good.

Taylor said Nebraska felt positive about the second half even though it trailed 38-13 at halftime.

"At halftime we just talked about it and we felt very confident that we could come back and win the game," he said. "We knew that would be tough to do. We knew we could do it. We came out, did the best we can and it just wasn't good enough. We were much better in the second half."

UCLA started its first drive of the second half at the Nebraska 36-yard line and moved 19 yards before Velasco hit a 34-yard field goal.

Nebraska received the ensuing kickoff and drove 65-yards for a touchdown. Taylor capped off the drive by scoring on a 1-yard run which cut UCLA's lead to 41-20 at the end of the third quarter.

The Huskers, 2-1, threatened to score early in the fourth quarter when they drove to the UCLA 36-yard line, but the drive stalled when Bruin

strong safety Matt Darby intercepted a Taylor pass that was deflected by Nebraska wingback Richard Bell.

"I think the interception that bounced off Rich Bell hurt badly," Nebraska coach Tom Osborne said. "We were moving. We still had time if we got that one in and got an onside kick. We still had a chance to win the game."

Nebraska tallied its final points when fullback Bryan Carpenter scored on a 5-yard touchdown run. A two-point conversion by Taylor brought the game to its final 41-28 outcome.

Donahue said the win helped the UCLA program. The Bruins' 41 points were the most scored against a Nebraska team since 1968 and the most scored against a Husker team coached by Osborne.

"It puts our program on a little different level — it gets the monkey off our back," Donahue said. "We had a stigma or reputation that we couldn't play with Nebraska, Okla-

homa, or that we couldn't play in the Big Eight. It's important we got rid of that. I really think it takes us to a different plateau and now people won't say that anymore."

Osborne said UCLA played well. "We just got a good whipping tonight," Osborne said. "UCLA was knocking us off the ball and were able to break some big plays."

The victory gave Donahue his 100th win at UCLA. Donahue said the win was a payback to Osborne, whose first and 100th victories came against the Bruins. Osborne was going for his 150th victory Saturday.

"It was nice I got my 100th against him," Donahue said. "He got his 100th against me and that was nice from my perspective. It was much more meaningful getting it against Nebraska than getting it next week or the following week. It was much more meaningful because it was a nationally televised game and it did a lot for our program and we looked impressive when we did it."
