Not for a long, long time. On September 21-25 in Omaha, River City Round-up will be held at Ak-sar-ben and the Central Park Mall. There'll be a parade, games, a rodeo and a chili cook-off. The 5th Annual German Festival is also scheduled late in the month in downtown Syracuse. There'll be music, folk dancing, soccer and crafts.

October 1 - 2, the Country Music Festival will take place in Fremont at the Christensen Field Parks and Recreation Department Auditorium. October 17 - 22 there'll be another Country Music Festival in Hastings at the Fairgrounds.

The Omaha Autumn Festival is scheduled for Nov. 4 - 6 at the Civic Auditorium. Artists will show works with autumn themes. Also early in the month, date as yet unannounced, people will gather for the River-Front Marathon and Ten-Kilometer Scenic Race in Omaha.
