He said agriculture is not the only program the Peace Corps offers. People of all ages and types may apply if they are at least 18.

Fredrick said he is not only looking for the traditional two-year volunteer, but also for associate Peace Corps volunteers.

"This is a new area which allows people to serve (in the Peace Corps) for three weeks, three months, or a year," he said.

Fredrick said that in America today, "most people look to a life of work — 30 to 35 years of the same career," doing the same job, with possible early retirement or sabbaticals.

"The Peace Corps volunteer experience has

caught up with that," he said. Now the Peace Corps offers experience not only for people who have finished college, but for people wanting to take a break in their career or have a change of pace when they retire.

He said a group of 82 volunteers was sworn in Friday in Morocco. Of these 82, 16 were over the age of 45.

"This is the new age in Peace Corps," he said.

According to Fredrick, the Peace Corps experience gives people an international perspective of language, other cultures and how business and education are conducted around the world.

"People get the big picture," he said.
