Kathryn Kelley of the Nebraska Bookstore foresees tremendous popularity for Spy Magazine's "Separated at Birth," a collection of unlikely celebrity photo pairings, such as Geraldine Ferraro and David Bowie.

For the younger people on a gift list, Kelley said Maurice Sendak's new "Dear Millie" and Chris Van Allsburg's familiar "The Polar Express" have both been selling well while Wattles mentioned She Silverstein's classic "Where the Sidewalk Ends" as a safe bet for a present.

Finally, spoofs of opular maga zines are still prevalent for the animal lover's howliday present. This season, "Vanity Fur" and "Teddy's Bearzaar" take their places on the shelf beside "Pupple" and last year's popular "Catmopolitan" and "Dogue."
