## Construction worker falls

A construction worker working in the north part of the NU Coliseum Friday suffered a concussion and broke his left arm after falling about 15 feet, according to police and hospital reports.

Gary Durlinger, who works for Kess Inc., fell after the ladder he was standing on slipped out from underneath him, said Lt. Ken Cauble of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Police. The accident occurred at about 3 p.m.

Matt Glenn, who was playing basketball nearby in the coliseum at the time of the accident, said Durlinger was unconscious for about a minute after he fell.

Glenn, an emergency medical technician in the Nebraska Army National Guard, said construction workers hurried out of the construction area after the accident, yelling for someone to give CPR. Durlinger did not have a heart attack, Glenn said.

Glenn, a junior biology major at UNL, said the man began to revive when he arrived on the scene.

Glenn said he applied pressure to a cut over Durlinger's left eye while another construction worker held Durlinger's head steady in case Durlinger had a broken neck.

Paramedics arrived about 10 minutes after the fall, Glenn said. They took Durlinger to Lincoln General Hospital. He was released Monday morning.

fight had not occurred.

Bart Vitek, president of Abel Hall, also spoke to the Abel-Sandoz Residence Association, urging them to tell students of the penalties for participation in a snowball fight -- probation or expulsion.

Petersen said UNL Police also have a better coordinated plan for stopping the fights with a more "proactive" position, rather than reactive after a fight starts.

Petersen said a few snowball fights broke out Monday afternoon, although UNL police said they did not know about them.

Cpl. Doug Petersen of the UNL Police said the department did not have any extra men on-call, but were patrolling 16th St. more than usual.

"It's stop -- before it gets started," he said of the plan.

James Griesen, vice chancellor for student affairs, said he was concerned about the possibility of a snowball fight too. His fears of a fight resurfaced Monday night while he was walking his dog. He said he made a snowball and realized the warmer temperatures made for "good packing weather."

But Griesen said he thought the efforts of Petersen and the residence hall leaders made a difference. There were some small fights Monday afternoon, but the police broke them up before they escalated, he said.

"I think everybody's ready for this one. The best snowball fight is one that doesn't happen," Griesen said.
