

Huskers used defense to hold off Jayhawks, Nee says

first half and Nebraska leading 28-19. "We wanted to go in (the locker room) with control of the game," Nee said. "At least a 10-point lead." The Huskers led 39-23 at half. Nebraska benefitted from its solid defense to hold off the Jayhawks, Nee

said. The Huskers forced Kansas to commit 20 turnovers while holding the Jayhawks to 44.2 percent shooting from the field. Kansas entered Saturday's game shooting 54.1 percent and committing 16 turnovers per game. "Our man-to-man and zone defense this week was solid," Nee said.

Nee also discussed the team Kansas defeated to win last year's NCAA title -- Oklahoma. The Sooners, ranked No. 1 in last week's Associated Press poll, dropped a 77-73 decision Saturday to Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Okla. Oklahoma will face Missouri, ranked No. 5 last week, Thursday in Norman, Okla.

Nec, who said Missouri got his vote for No. 1 in this week's poll, wasn't offering predictions on Thursday's game. "That's a tough one," he said. "I don't know." The Big Eight, Nee said, is better overall than last year, when five teams qualified for the NCAA tour-

ament. "From top to bottom it is," he said. "I don't know if we can have the banner year, the premier year we had last year, but it's more competitive from top to bottom." Nebraska's next game is on Wednesday, when the Huskers face Colorado.
