Nebraska men's tennis coach Kerry McDermott said Tuesday that the Cornhuskers used the motto that the Huskers had the lead, and "came in like a lamb and went out like a lion" en route to finishing 3rd in the 24-team tournament. Nebraska opened the tournament by defeating Northeast Louisiana 5-2, then de-feated Texas and West Virginia 5-1 prior to dropping a 5-2 decision to Clemson.

McDermott said the key victory for Nebraska at the HEB Tennis Center came against top-seeded and ninth-ranked Texas. The Huskers posted their first victory against a top-10 team when they defeated the Longhorns in the tournament's second round.


McDermott said he hopes Sjoholm is ranked in the top-90 next weekend.
