Thursday morning after votes were counted, Kirstine said the Elec oral Commission would challenge mow in order to hold the election
bylaw, because there isn't enough time before Wednesday.
By next fall, Kirstine said, the commission will "overhaul" the bylaw to make it "more detailed." The commission will target the section of Bylaw X that requires candidates for executive positions and hall presidents to get 50 percent or more of the vote in order to win, she said.
If the commission overhauls the bylaw according to Kirstine's plan, these candidates would only need to get a plurality of voters.
Kirstine said voter turnout Wednesday was approximately year's election.
