With the real threat of death imminent for anyone to be found without a home, maybe serious programs at the state and federal levels would finally be realized. On a more personal scale, in passing the homeless on the street, people might be moved to action knowing that inaction would result in death. The homeless would become visible people, rather than the transparent population they are now.

I can already hear arguments that "such a proposal is ludicrous, it sim-ply can't be done. After all," some would say, "the homeless are people too, and they have Constitutional rights. Why just recently they fought in court and won the right to vote.' Some would probably shout other legal arguments, "Hey, you can't punish someone for having a particular status, like homelessness.
