Nebraska basketball recruit Bruce Chubick's shoulder injury probably won't affect his career as a Corn-

But Chubick, a two-time All-State election from Atkinson West Holt, aid his dislocated shoulder occurred

at a bad time. Chubick injured his right shoulder while diving for a ball during Atkinon West Holt's final regular-season

game. Atkinson West Holt, the state's No. 1-rated Class C-1 team at the time, still managed to advance to the district final before losing 51-50 to Battle Creek at Norfolk High

That loss cost West Holt, which finished 21-1, the chance to defend its 1988 Class C-1 state title. Chubick played against Battle Creek despite his injury, but he said West Holt's fate may have been different had he

Chubick Sr., who coached his son in high school, said the surgery will be performed by Nebraska team physicians Dr. Tom Heiser and Dr. Pat Clare at St. Elizabeth Community Health Center in Lincoln. Chubick said his son's rehabilitation period should be about three months.

Three long months, Chubick Jr.

"There's no good time when you're dedicated."

But Chubick Jr., a right-handed shooter, said he'll play basketball during his rehabilitation period.

"I'll get the ball out and work with my left hand," he said.
