their expectations. When asked about influences, the band members said, literally, "everything." Pentes said the band spends a great deal of time listening to records, watching new music shows like MTV's "120 Minutes," and listening to college radio. Specific favorite bands mentioned were The Beastie Boys, Prince, The Cure, and Indigo Girls. Pentes said that "Monster" is more of a group effort than its previous album, "Galaxy 500." "We wanted to write together for this album," she said. The last album was written almost completely by Nicholls, Pitkin, and Pentes, but for "Monster," the band took more time to write the songs as an entire group, Pentes said. The fact that Stasium went

through a pre-production process with the band also was different, Stewart said. This gave band members an objective opinion on the songs before they started recording, Stewart said. "He helped us to shave out some of the excess," he said. "Monster" is in large part a result of the displeasure the band felt with "Galaxy 500" in its finished form, Nicholls said. "I'm totally happy with the vocal sound on this record," she said. "It's what I sound like in my own head. And the record sounds like what we want to hear live." When Nicholls was asked about her process and inspiration for writing lyrics, she jokingly replied -- "It's a channeling process. I set up amethyst crystals, sulphur and incense. Don Henley is at the other end of the channel."

"But seriously," she said, "I'm really inspired by everything. Being alive, having a good day, or having a bad day. It's just my means of communicating publicly, so I write lyrics about everything." Nicholls said that Fetchin' Bones' music is "heavier" than a lot of current college music. She added that she would compare the band with some of the louder college bands, like The Replacements. Stewart had another way to look at it. "I see a strum versus riff dichotomy in rock music," he said. "Some college bands just pick a bunch of chords and strum forever. We riff." The band currently is touring in the Northeast, and will be working through the Midwest in November, when they'll "hopefully" hit Nebraska, Nicholls said.

interesting, and Danna Pentes shows competence and some dexterity on bass in the song "Mr. Bad." "Love Crushing" and "Bonework," also are solid, muscular rock songs. "Monster" is at its worst on "Say The Word" and "Spot," which, owing to bad keyboards and bad backing vocals, sound a little more like commercials than songs. In other places, where the band backs down a bit for slower, subtler songs like "Deep Blue," or "Cross," the results are better, and the influences less direct. But even these songs sound more like the standard emerging alternative pop of the last few years than anything this band has done itself. This is probably the most disturbing factor of "Monster" -- in its en-

tirey, it sounds more like an amalgamation of the newest records by The Cult, R.E.M. and The Replacements, than any of the previous Fetchin' Bones albums. The above bands have received much applause from critics and fans for coming out of their respective dooms, glooms and garages, but it's time to start realizing that while the new trends may result in good initial-impact rock 'n' roll, in the long run they have inspired homogeneousness, and blandness. The example here is simple -- a few years ago, there was absolutely no danger of anyone confusing The Cult's "Love," with Fetchin' Bones' "Bad Pumpkin" or "Cabin Flounder." But in the spaces when Nicholls is not singing, "Monster" easily could be mistaken for "Sonic Temple."
