These areas include updating of the NU role and mission statements; clarification of board and CEO rela-tionship; re-evaluation of central administration in areas of function, efficiency and personnel; and an ongoing system of long-range plan-ning by the campuses and the univer-sity.

It was a consensus that the chancellors should have relative autonomy over management of students, facilities and academic functions. The president and central administration should be concerned with long-range plans, coordinated services and strategies consistent with the role and mission statements.

Blank said the responses were "very thought-provoking." The board should study the responses thoroughly, and begin to formulate their criteria for a new president, he

The completion of the question-tire does not mean the end of the self-analysis process t"by any stretch of the imagination," Blank said. However, he said, the board now can move forward to begin the me-chanics of the presidential search.






ponents of the official vote in other states included students' lack of ex-perience and maturity and a possible conflict of interest, he said. But, he said, those arguments are casily rebutted.
