'Old Glory' to be moved this spring

There soon will be an empty space in the Cather Garden where the "Old Glory" sculpture now stands, said Bob Carpenter, campus architect at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

"Old Glory" will be moved this spring to its permanent resting spot in the Pedestrian Plaza, on the north side of the Lied Center for Performing Arts, he said.

The sculpture, created by Mark diSuvero, was bought specifically for the Lied Center, said George Neubert, director of the Sheldon Art Gallery.

Neubert said the sculpture must be disassembled and repainted

before the move. The process will cost several thousand dollars, he said.

"Old Glory" was purchased in February 1987 and has been in the Cather Garden since the spring of

that year, Carpenter said.

The piece cost about \$500,000, Neubert said. The money, raised specifically for the purchase of the sculpture, came from private sources, he said.

longer exist and adding new scholarships, she said.

The company was founded in the late 1970s, Menzer said.

Menzer said the Academic Guidance Service is listed with the Better Business Bureau. Students who are concerned about the company's legitimacy may talk to the the bureau, she said.

The company has a database of 10,000 entries of financial aid sources, Menzer said.

Professor will deliver Morris lecture Monday

An Arizona State University professor will deliver the second annual Roberta A. Morris Memorial Lecture at 3 p.m. Monday.

Nancy Felipe Russó, director of women's studies and professor of psychology at Arizona State, will speak on "Psychological Aspects of Unwanted Pregnancy and Abortion: Legal Implications."

She will discuss research findings related to maternal and child welfare issues in abortion, and will examine consequences of restrictive abortion policies to women, their families and society.

The free lecture is co-sponsored by the psychology department and the College of Law and will be in the Great Hall of the Wick Alumni Center.

The lecture series was established in memory of Morris, a UNL faculty member who died in June 1988.

be sold meets the required distance at 170 feet.

Nebraska law states that alcohol cannot be sold within 150 feet of university property.

Because the food-court area is the only part of the Reunion that would be licensed, Hunter said, that section would be separated from the rest of the Reunion by a decorative iron fence.

Customers would not be allowed to take beer out of the fenced area, he said.

Hunter called the application for a beer license an "opportunity for everyone to work together."

Senators' support of the plan would show the UNL administration that students are responsible enough to handle beer drinking, he said.

Before deciding to apply for a beer license, Hunter said, he conducted a survey of the "pros and cons" of alcohol use at UNL.

"One of the most flagrant situations that we observed was the continual illegal use of the parking lots and the alcohol consumption by all of the people that had the sizable check-books that can contribute to the athletic department," he said.

Allowing that type of alcohol use while denying students of legal drinking age the opportunity to drink in the Reunion is unfair, Hunter said.

He said he will submit his application for a license to the Nebraska Liquor Commission next week.
