McCartney praised Nebraska's defense.

"We couldn't run our option game effectively, because their free safety was down our throats," McCartney said. "All year long, when teams have done that to us, we threw the ball. But we couldn't do that today because of our inability to protect our quarterback."

But McCartney said Hagan's athletic ability is what saved the Buffs.

"I thought he did an absolutely terrific job out there today," he said. "To have a quarterback like that -- with his ability to improvise and

Seizys -- who finished the year as the leading receiver with nine catches for 155 yards -- was an important part of the Huskers' game plan against Waldorf, Thorell said.

"He was a guy we needed to get the ball to," Thorell said, "because he's probably as big a threat guy as we have."

Seizys said his performance against Waldorf made up for some trouble he had during the rest of the season.

"This game was great," said the 5-foot 8-inch, 166-pound freshman. "All year I've kind of been bobbling the punts. I got the one today and the touchdown, so that really helped... It was my birthday today (Friday), so that really added to it."

Colorado's fans, McCartney said, were also a big factor in the win. He said he is pleased to see the entire community supporting the Buffs the way they have all season.

"That student body wants to go to Miami as badly as we do," McCartney said. "I've seen a lot of stadiums, but I've never seen a crowd like that."

Hagan said it's too early to be talking about the national championship, and maybe even too early to talk about the Orange Bowl.

Thorell cited graduate assistant Jeff Jamrog's job with the junior varsity linebacking corps as a reason for the team's success. He said Daren Williams, a scholarship linebacker from Chicago, Ill., was the team's most-improved defensive player.

Thorell, who is now 10-4-1 after three years as the junior varsity coach, said left tackle John Butala was the most-improved player on offense.

"We've made a lot of progress... I think everyone improved over the course of the year," Thorell said. "Finishing 3-1-1 is a fairly good season for us."

"I feel good about the way they finished the season and, hopefully, a lot of these guys can go on to have a good future here."

Free safety Tim James, however, was ready to discuss New Year's Day plans.

"We're going to Miami," he said. "We knew that if our offense kept coming back, there was no way they were going to beat us."

"We've been on a mission all year," Hagan said. "I don't think we're great right now. At the end of the season, we'll talk about how great we are."

**Wrestlers prepare for 1989 season**  
Nebraska's Corey Olson made a strong bid to earn a starting job during the Cornhusker wrestling team's exhibition match Friday at Harvard.  
Olson pinned Tucker Thompson in the 177-pound competition. That performance was critical, as the 177-pound class was one of three in which starters had not been named.  
The other weights in which wrestlers were battling for starting positions were in the 118 and 158-pound classes. In the 118-pound competition, John Buxton decided on Butch McFee 3-0 and Jim Sanchez decided on Jeremie Eckley 3-2, while Dan Harrison decided on Jamie Penning 7-2 in the 158-pound competition.  
Nebraska, which is ranked No. 6 by Amateur Wrestling News, opens its season Friday against Wyoming. The match begins at 8:30 p.m. in Laramie, Wyo.
