## Faculty backs senate restructuring

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln Faculty Senate announced Tuesday that faculty members, in a referendum by mail, overwhelmingly supported a restructuring

Under the plan, the senate would increase from 60 to 90 members and would be renamed the Academic Senate. A separate UNL Assembly would consist of the chancellor, five vice chancellors, three deans and other faculty members.

Senate representation would include one representative for every five or more faculty members in a department. Currently, each sena-tor represents 25 faculty members in one or more departments. Faculty members approved the proposal by a vote of 363-39 in the referendum. The proposal still must be approved by the NU Board of

Regents, Faculty Senate President James McShane said the proposed changes would be effective in representing UNL faculty members.
