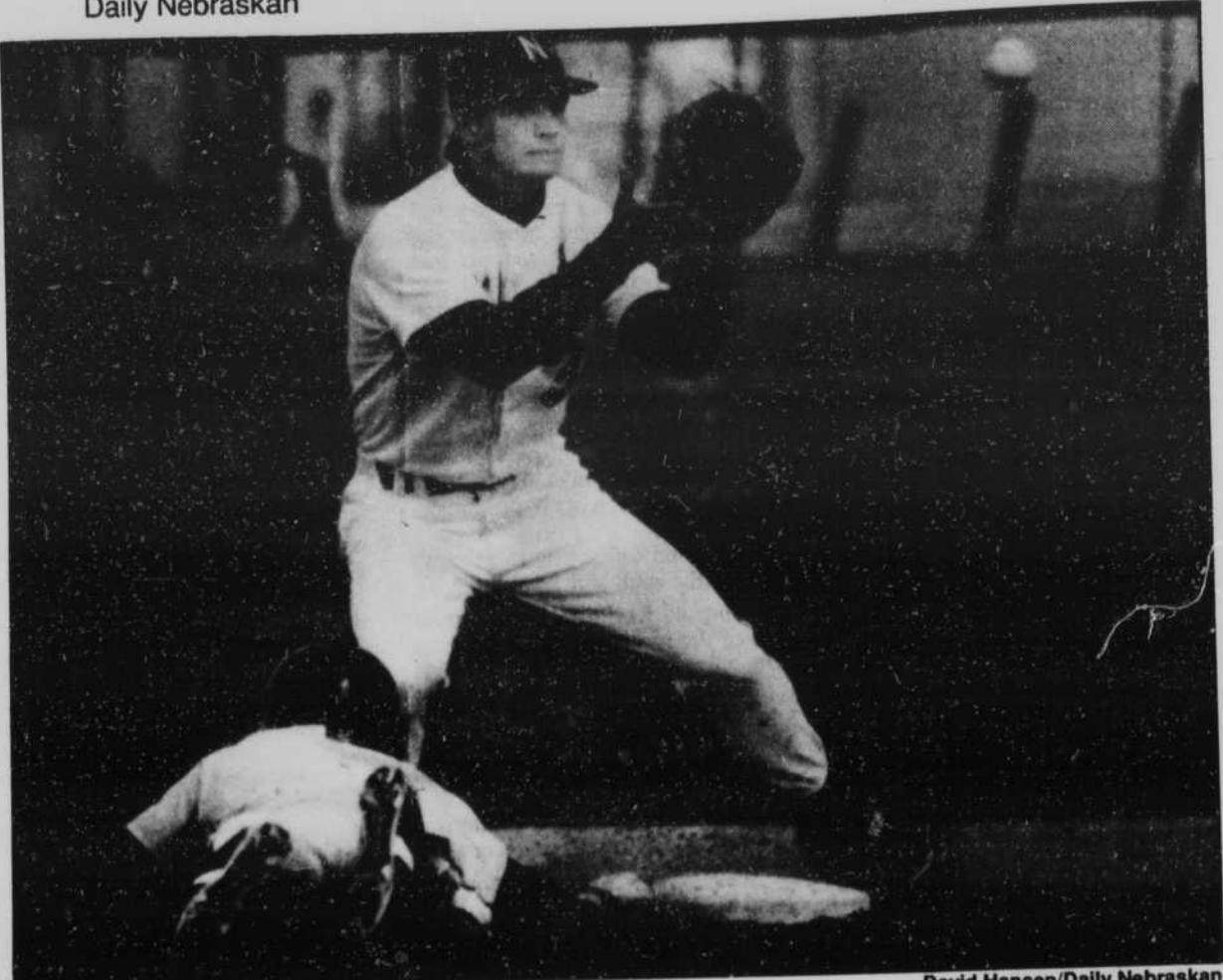

A native of San Francisco, Jordan said his transition to Lincoln life has been as easy as his transition to Nebraska baseball. He is thinking about moving to Lincoln for good, he said, because of the town's close relationship with the team.

The weather wasn't a shock, ei-

ther, he said. And one benefit of Lincoln's cold, he said, is the artificial turf -- and even surface -- at Buck Beltzer Stadium.

Jordan was drafted in the 10th round last June by the Los Angeles Dodgers, and he earned All-Northern California honors last year at Canada College. Division I baseball in the Midwest is a step up, he said, but he has been prepared.

"I believe at each level up you have to be little more mentally tough," he said.

Part of the toughness, he said, is needed to get ready for each game. He said he played about 20 games a

year in high school, about 40 a year in junior college, and he will have to play about 70 this season.

With many of those games coming against the Briar Cliff's and Tarkio's of the world instead of the Wichita State's, motivation is a key. Last week the Huskers were tripped up by St. Cloud State in the last of another four-game set. Jordan said the Huskers are now focused to win all of the little ones on the way to the March 30 conference opener against Kansas.

"We're trying as a team to play consistently," he said, "one game at a time."

NU baseball game canceled for Tuesday

The Nebraska baseball team's game against Wayne State College that was scheduled for Tuesday night has been canceled.

The cancellation means the Cornhuskers will not play their next home game until March 28, when Nebraska faces Briar Cliff College of Sioux City, Iowa, in a double-

header at Buck Beltzer Field. The games begin at 4 p.m.

Nebraska's next game is Sunday, when the Huskers travel to Fort Collins, Colo., to face Colorado State. The Huskers also will face Colorado State on March 26 and will square off against Northern Colorado on March 27 in Greeley, Colo.
