The band doesn't have lyrics that mention the word "love" in every sentence like typical pop-sounding bands...

Using different instruments, del Amitri takes several plain songs, and just like salting popcorn, they spice it up.

Writing lyrics has been good for del Amitri band leader, lead singer and bass player Justin Currie, with

punk as his original motivator. But the band has been through a lot of changes. Even though only two of the remaining band members still make up del Amitri, the content of the lyrics remains emotionally realizing.

"Nobody's perfect, and that's something that I'm sure she'll know/'Cos trying to tell her lies from the truth at times/Is like trying to divide ice from snow."

The changes the band has undergone since its first album have been substantial.

"The music's changed so much since then that the current band is hardly connected to the old one,"

Currie said in a press release.

The band has received good response from its fans. Fans went as far as providing room and board and setting up gigs in their own towns to help the band during its first American tour in 1986.

Del Amitri, which got its start in Glasgow, Scotland, currently is made up of Ian Harvie on guitar and Currie. Several other artists were recruited strictly for recording purposes.

It isn't likely that del Amitri is going to take America by storm, at least not yet. But remember, when a sticker in your foot becomes infected, it explodes.

is so stimulating.

The best song, "Head On," is typical Jesus and Mary Chain, filled to the brim with loud, distorted guitars mixing in and out of the vocals. Also, there is a heavy drum-beat roughly blending with the guitars and vocals to add some diversity to the song.

The group pulls a rarity on

"Drop." The song is entirely acoustic with very soft drums. It doesn't

even sound at all like The Jesus and Mary Chain. But after one look at the confusing lyrics, recognition of the band becomes clear.

The Jesus and Mary Chain haven't fulfilled the "chain saw in a hurricane sound" of "Psychocandy" with "Automatic," but they have done an excellent job trying to recreate its mystique.

"Automatic" definitely is an album for all Jesus and Mary Chain fans.

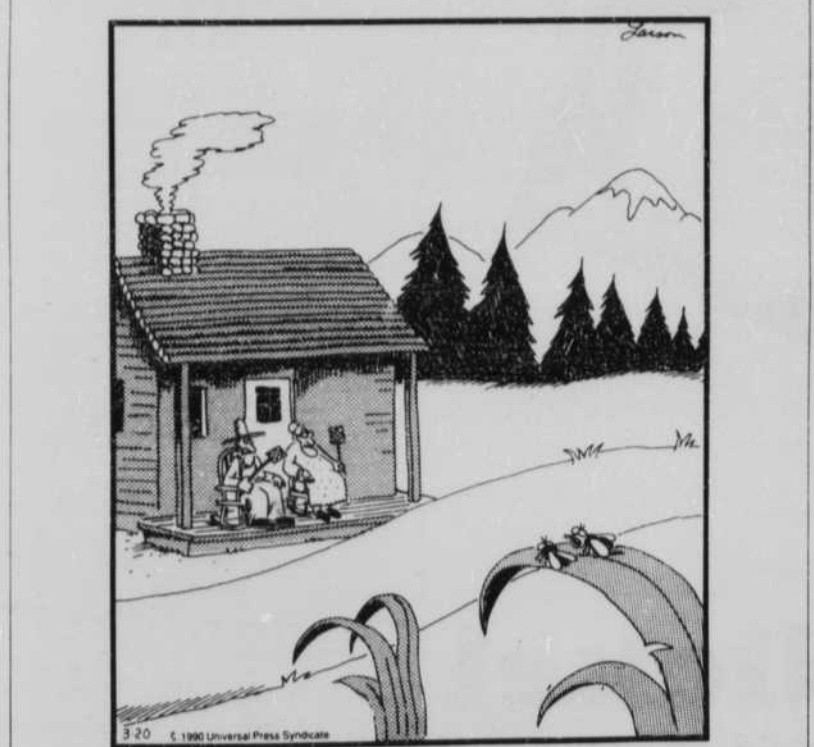
