For some rip-roarin' Southside Chicago blues, Magic Slim and the Teardrops is just the ticket. He truly is a magician. They play from 2:40-3:50 p.m.

Perhaps the highlight of the festivities comes when the ever popular Charlie Burton and the Hiccups bring their humorous, blues-oriented rock 'n' roll to the stage. They will aston-

ish from 4:10-5:10 p.m.

If you're a little bit country, sit in at 5:30 p.m. for The Sandy Creek Band.

Take yourself back to the '60s and '70s with Mr. Peabody from 6:40-7:35 p.m.

The schedule here is a mirror of Friday's events, with the same performers returning for those who missed the first shows.


