### NU baseball team 'wins' exhibitions

Nebraska's baseball team "won" two exhibition games against Neosho County Community College Sunday afternoon at Buck Beltzer Field.

Cornhusker coach John Sanders said he didn't think there were official results, though Nebraska assuredly scored more runs.

"There was a rough score somewhere in there," Sanders said. "I'm worried about improvement."

The games were the first of the fall season for Nebraska.

Senior right fielder Shawn Buchanan had a day that included a two-run home run to right-center and a three-run double to left. Buchanan, one of the team's offensive co-captains this spring, said the Huskers normally play intrasquad games in the fall. Exhibitions, he said, give the young players a chance to face other college competition and let the team play a common enemy.

"These really help the team come together," he said.

Nebraska will play Iowa Western Community College in another exhibition at 7 p.m. Thursday at Buck Beltzer Field.

### Huskers beat Regis College; lose game to Colorado State

NORTH PLATTE (AP) - Nebraska lost to Colorado State 6-1 and beat Regis College of Denver 10-0 to finish second at the three-day Kearney State Invitational softball tournament Sunday.

The Cornhuskers' lone run against Colorado State came on a solo home run by Misti Guenther in the seventh inning.

It was the Huskers' second loss to Colorado State, losing 6-4 Saturday. Colorado State went 6-0, Nebraska 4-2.

Nebraska's other earlier games in the tournament included wins over Kearney State 17-2 and 14-4, and over Regis 17-0.

## Shula gets win No. 200

### Miami 30, Buffalo 7

Sammie Smith scored two touchdowns on short runs and gained 56 yards on 18 carries as Miami (2-0) took the lead in the AFC East for the first time since December 1985. The Dolphins, who allowed 280 rushing yards in losing to the Bills last December, outgained Buffalo (1-1) 128-44 this time.

Miami's Don Shula became the fourth NFL coach to win 200 games.

### Phoenix 23, Philadelphia 21

Al Del Greco kicked a 42-yard field goal, his third of the final quarter, with 25 seconds remaining, giving Phoenix coach Joe Bugel his first victory.

Trailing 21-20 in the last minute, Cardinals quarterback Timm Rosenbach engineered a 58-yard drive, the key a 26-yard pass interference penalty on Ben Smith that took the ball to the Phoenix 44. Rosenbach was sacked six times and intercepted once. Philadelphia (0-2) blew a 14-0 lead.

### Bears 31, Packers 13

Jim Harbaugh passed for two touchdowns and ran for another, and Trace Armstrong and Richard Dent each had two sacks.

The Bears (2-0) sacked Anthony Dilweg six times and recovered three fumbles -- two by Dilweg -- that led to touchdowns. Armstrong also recovered a fumble.

### Rams 35, Bucs 14

Jim Everett completed 18 of 25 passes for 269 yards and four touchdowns for the Rams (1-1), who also got a 44-yard touchdown when Bobby Humphrey intercepted Vinny Testaverde on the final play of the first half.

Testaverde, the NFL's top-rated quarterback after leading Tampa Bay (1-1) to a 38-21 victory over Detroit,

completed 9 of 18 passes for 127 yards.

### Jets 24, Browns 21

Freeman McNeil rushed for one touchdown and set up another on a 59-yard screen pass from Ken O'Brien as New York (1-1) gave Coach Bruce Coslet his first victory. McNeil, waived at the end of preseason and then reclaimed, rushed for 62 yards and caught three passes for 80 yards.

Cleveland (1-1), which rushed for only 80 yards last week, gained only 44 this week.

### Patriots 16, Colts 14

Jason Staurovsky kicked field goals of 39, 27 and 25 yards in the second half, and New England intercepted rookie quarterback Jeff George four times.

George completed a 68-yard touchdown pass to Bill Brooks for the game's final touchdown with 2:16 to play. Indianapolis (0-2) tried an onside kick, but Ronnie Lippett covered it for New England (1-1).

### Lions 21, Falcons 14

Rodney Peete threw two touchdown passes as Detroit beat Atlanta in a battle of run-and-shoot teams. Peete completed 13 of 26 passes for 167 yards, all in the first half. He was replaced by Bob Gagliano after an ineffective third period.

Barry Sanders carried 18 times for 55 yards, including the deciding TD on a 17-yard run for a 21-7 lead just before halftime.

In other games, it was Minnesota 32, New Orleans 3; Cincinnati 21, San Diego 16; New York Giants 28, Dallas 7; Los Angeles Raiders 17, Seattle 13; San Francisco 26, Washington 13.

Houston was at Pittsburgh late, while Kansas City visits Denver tonight.

## Defeat of Colorado highlights weekend battles

### Illinois 23, Colorado 22

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) - Howard Griffith plunged for a 1-yard touchdown with 1:18 left Saturday, as No. 21-ranked Illinois rallied to beat ninth-ranked Colorado 23-22.

The Illini (1-1) tied the game 17-17 in the third quarter, but Colorado (1-1-1) regained the lead with a safety just before the period ended.

Jim Harper put the Buffaloes up 22-17 with a 26-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter. But Illini quarterback Jason Verduzco used long passes to Jeff Finke, Steve Mueller and Wagner Lester to set up Griffith's game-winning touchdown. A two-point conversion failed.

### Oklahoma 52, Pitt 10

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Kenyon Rasheed, Ike Lewis and Dewell Brewer all ran for more than 100 yards Saturday as No. 14 Oklahoma flattened 13th-ranked Pitt, 52-10, the Sooners' second straight impressive victory.

Oklahoma (2-0) rolled up 529 yards of offense -- 450 on the ground -- and took advantage of every Pitt mistake. The Panthers (2-1) lost three fumbles and had two passes intercepted, resulting in 31 Oklahoma points.

The 52 points were the most given up by Pitt since a 55-10 loss to Penn State in 1971.

Rasheed bulled for 122 yards on 13 carries, including touchdown runs of 11 and 7 yards in the first half.

Lewis carried 14 times for 110 yards, while Brewer had 107 yards on eight carries.

### Minnesota 20, Iowa St. 16

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) - Scott Schaffner, benched last week, replaced injured Marquel Fleetwood and threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Grant with 2:12 to play Saturday, lifting Minnesota to a 20-16 victory over Iowa State.

Star tailback Blaise Bryant and quarterback Chris Peere were injured for Iowa State (1-1). Bryant, the fourth-leading rusher in NCAA Division I last year with 1,516 yards, suffered a deep bruise in his right shoulder and had to leave in the second quarter with 69 yards. Pedersen sustained possible ligament damage to his right knee during the Cyclones' final drive.

Iowa State is 0-19-1 against the Gophers since last winning in 1898.

### Kansas St. 52, New Mexico St. 7

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) -- Pat Jackson rushed for 149 yards and four touchdowns as Kansas State swamped winless New Mexico State 52-7 Saturday for the second-highest point total in its checkered football history.

New Mexico State, losing its 20th in a row, didn't penetrate farther than Kansas State's 21-yard line until a Wildcat fumble led to Billy Borten's 6-yard touchdown run against the reserves with 8:55 left.

Jackson's four touchdowns tied a Kansas State record he shares with two others. The Wildcats, off to their first 2-0 start since 1982, scored 42 points in the first two periods for their highest-scoring half since World War II.

### Missouri 45, Utah St. 10

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Ronnell Kayhill ran for three touchdowns and Michael Jones for two as Missouri, scoring at will in the first half, smashed Utah State 45-10 Saturday with an offense producing 518 yards.

### Louisville 28, Kansas 16

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) -- Browning Nagle passed for 304 yards and two touchdowns and Ralph Dawkins ran for two more as Louisville withstood an error-filled third quarter to defeat Kansas 28-16 Saturday.

### Notre Dame 28, Michigan 24

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP) - Rick Mirer, making his first college start, threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to Adrian Jarrell with 1:40 left, capping a fourth-quarter rally that gave top-ranked Notre Dame a 28-24 victory over No. 4 Michigan.

Trailing 24-21, Notre Dame drove 76 yards in nine plays for the touchdown that extended its home winning streak to 18 games. The score was set up by an 11-yard pass from Mirer to Raghib Ismail, who recovered from a bruised sternum in the first half.

Notre Dame snuffed out Michigan's next drive when Reggie Brooks intercepted an Elvis Grbac pass on the Irish 40 with 1:21 remaining. Michigan got the ball back with 15 seconds left on its own 29, but Grbac was unable to connect on two desperation passes.
