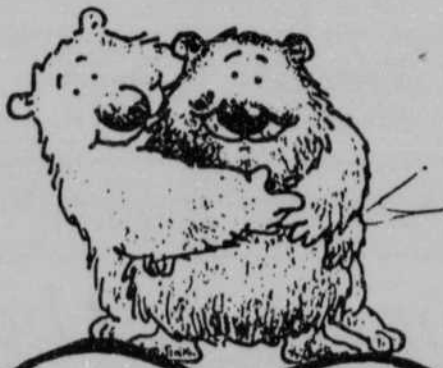

much fun for Nebraska fans and Oklahoma haters. About 14,500 members of both groups will pack the Bob Devaney Sports Center to watch the Huskers play the Sooners that night.

No, the Huskers aren't the Sooners this year. Come Saturday, every Nebraska backer will be thankful for that.

your career if you're dedicated to the sport."

Last year, Novak recorded 1,553 set assists and guided the Cornhuskers to a 32-3 record and their 15th consecutive Big Eight Championship. She also was tabbed an All-American for the second consecutive year.

But despite playing for one of the best programs in the nation, Novak said there is no comparison between college players and U.S. National Team members.

"It's a whole new level," Novak

said. "The players here have been in the game for so long, and they've been playing together a lot."

Three setters are in front of Novak, including former Husker All-American Lori Endicott, who starts for the national team. Novak said she needs to raise her level of play and improve her ball-handling skills to break into the top three and make the team.

Novak said that former Husker assistant John Cook, who is an assistant for the U.S. men's team, has helped make her transition easier.

"Cook has been a big help," Novak said. "When you don't know anybody and you're in a new town, knowing somebody can make a big difference."
