Americans love football, the Olympics, baseball, basketball and figure skating.

They hate to watch wrestling, golf, boxing, Roller Derby and hockey or at least enough people do to put those sports atop the least-popular

Those are some of the findings of survey of America's sports tastes. People were asked to give their opinions of 71 participant sports and 114 spectator sports.

Professional football topped all sports with 39 percent of Americans saying they loved it or considered it one of their favorites. NCAA football ran second, followed by the Winter Olympics, Summer Olympics, major league baseball, high school football,

NBA basketball and figure skating. Some major sports flopped in the survey. NHL hockey ranked 40th, men's pro tennis 68th, women's pro tennis 71st and World Cup soccer


