"After he hooked me on a shot, I got motivated and ready to play. Mueller also blamed the Bob Devaney Sports Center's courts for his problems. "These are the worst facilities I've ever seen," said Mueller, who also had troubles at No. 1 doubles with Scott Randolph, edging their Shocker counterparts 4-6, 7-6, 7-5. "I'm very happy that Big Eight play is outdoors, and not here." 
