Halsne slams Bluejays for win

Bases loaded, two outs, bottom of the seventh inning and the Nebraska women's softball team trailing by a run.

One pitch later, the pitch that turned into Ann Halsne's grand slam, the Cornhuskers had swept the Creighton Bluejays in a doubleheader Wednesday night.

The seventh inning of the second game set up like this: With two outs, Misti Guenther reached on an error. Creighton pitcher Dedeann Pendleton walked Kris Vucurevic and Michelle Cuddeford.

Then Halsne hit her first collegiate grand slam and the second one ever hit at the Nebraska Softball Complex.

"My team deserves the most of the credit for the grand slam because they kept the inning alive for me," Halsne said.

The home run was Halsne's only hit of the doubleheader, but she drove in the winning run in both games. In the first game, she hit a game-winning sacrifice fly in the 10th inning.

Halsne joined the softball team after completing her senior year with Nebraska's women's basketball team.

"The philosophies and the coaching in softball are different, but the competitiveness in both sports is the

same," Halsne said. "Things are starting to come along and I'm happy with what I've accomplished so far."

Husker coach Ron Wolforth said Halsne had been getting just a bit underneath pitches prior to the grand slam pitch.

Halsne agreed, saying she had been adjusting her swing up and down throughout both games.

"The pitch I hit for the grand slam was a meatball, so I adjusted to it," Halsne said. "When I came to the plate for my last at-bat, I was thinking of just getting a hit."

"I knew I was going to get that last at-bat and produce something."

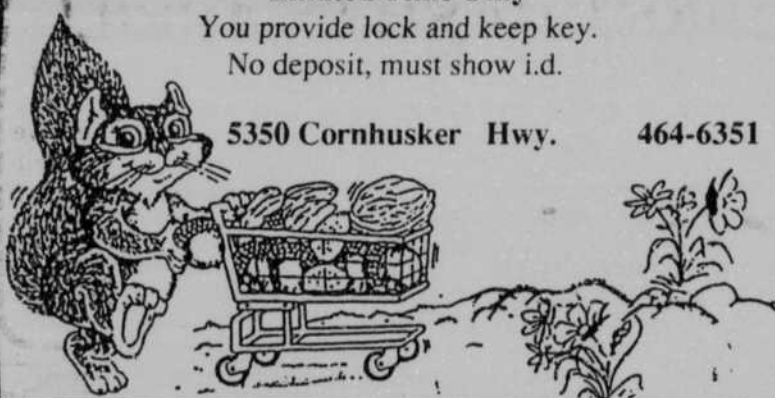
