Lied Center for the Performing Arts. The university also received \$1.1 million in research funds and \$1 million for museum, library and fine arts funding, according to the press release. The rest of the funds were divided among a variety of areas, Morin said.

The market value of foundation assets, which determines how much funding is available to the university, reached a record \$244.8 million in fiscal year 1991, Klein said. This value increased by \$28.2 million over fiscal year 1990.

The foundation is a non-profit corporation created to supplement NU student and faculty support, academic

programs and facilities. The foundation achieves this through donations and investments from alumni, friends, corporations and other foundations.

According to the press release, gifts and investments to the NU Foundation amounted to \$39.3 million in fiscal year 1991, the third highest total in the foundation's history. This amount exceeded the expectations of the foundation, Klein said.

"This year, we had no major donor, yet without a major donor we were still able to reach \$26.3 million in gifts alone," she said.

In fiscal year 1990, the NU Foundation received a record \$46.4 million in gifts and investments, partly due to \$6 million donated by the Lied Foundation.

Donations have increased over the past decade, Klein said.

"A decade ago, our total gifts and investments reached \$10 million," she said. "This amount has snowballed since then."

The foundation relies on the loyalty of alumni and Friends of the Foundation for contributions, Klein said.

"Loyalty is the starting point in making a charitable contribution," she said.

Klein said she didn't think 1992 donations would be affected by the 1991 total of gifts and investments.

"The amount of donations and contributions we receive relies on a broad spectrum of factors," she said. "It's mainly an individual choice."

paper in addition to aluminum.

"We are trying to be successful first, and then we will concentrate on the paper and glass issues after we have student's support," he said.

Glass and paper pose logistical problems because they are heavy and hard to store and sort, he said. Also, it is harder to justify the costs of recycling paper because there is little profit.

Perkins Loan checks to be distributed

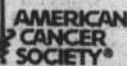
