Kansas, 1-1 in dual competition, is a balanced and well coached team, he said.

"They have no real weak spots," Bentz said.

Kansas has defeated Missouri, 157-74, and has lost to Southern Methodist, 138-99. Nebraska also has lost to Southern Methodist, 136-105, and has beaten Texas Christian, 138-103, last week.

The Huskers need to get focused and determined from the outset to beat the talented Kansas team, Bentz said.

"This being a competitive sport, you learn to respond to the competi-

tion," he said.

Women's coach Ray Huppert said Nebraska would match up against Kansas better in the later part of the season.

"These are two excellent teams," Huppert said. "It's good to have this meet when both teams are swimming at more of a peak performance."

The Kansas-Nebraska dual normally is scheduled in February, but it was moved up this year to compensate for an earlier Big Eight tournament and the Olympic trials, Huppert said.

Although Kansas is a conference opponent, this meet will not have a bearing on the Big Eight championship, he said. The conference meet will determine the title.

"In swimming, we have two sea-

sons," Huppert said. "The dual records have no reflection in the championship meet."

He said the divers, coached by Jim Hocking, have been a strength for Nebraska.

"Coach Hocking has done a great job and he has some fine athletes," Huppert said.

Nebraska should also be strong in the distance free with Michelle Butcher, two-time Big Eight swimmer of the year, he said.

"We need to make big strides forward in other events to be competitive this early," Huppert said.

The women's team is 1-2 with losses coming to Iowa 154-145 and to Brigham Young 155-145, and a 181-110 win against Utah last week.

both first-year starters, combined for 18 tackles against Colorado.

Petko said Nebraska's younger defenders have progressed well.

"We've matured," he said. "I knew those (younger) guys were good. They might make some mistakes, (but) I knew and the coaches knew that they'd go 100 percent. When you go 100 percent, mistakes can sometimes be left behind."

Turner said Nebraska's offense has

left its mistakes from the first half of last week's Colorado game behind. Nebraska gained less than 100 yards against the Buffaloes in the first half.

"We have a positive attitude because we feel we played well in the fourth quarter against Colorado," Turner said. "We moved the ball when we had to."

But the Huskers may have a hard time rushing this week. Kansas ranks second in the conference and 22nd in the country against the run.

"They have a big, physical, defensive line so we're not going to be able to run the ball as much," Turner said.

Tennis team to face Kansas

Revenge is on the minds of some of the Nebraska men's tennis players this weekend.

Nebraska will compete in the Midwest Regional ITCA Team Tournament in Des Moines, Iowa, this weekend, beginning today against Kansas. The Huskers lost to Kansas at the same tournament in 1989, when the Jayhawks defeated Nebraska 5-4 in the finals.

Kansas got the best of the Huskers last year, too, when the Jayhawks came to Lincoln and left town with a 7-2 win and the conference title.

Nebraska Coach Kerry McDermott said that if the Huskers don't give their all against Kansas, Nebraska's woes against the Jayhawks will continue for at least another year.

"I want our guys to go in there and fight to the death," he said. "If we give less than our 100 percent, we won't win."

The Midwest's top six teams will compete in the tournament. Along with Kansas, the Huskers will have to battle Big Eight rivals Colorado and Iowa State, as well as Missouri Valley Conference powers Drake and Wichita State.

McDermott said this is the most important tournament Nebraska will play in all year for many reasons.

"The regional team rankings will be based on this weekend's tourney," he said. "The tourney will also give everybody a good idea of who the teams are to beat in the region."

McDermott said all of his players are going to have to be at the top of their games in order for the Huskers to come away with the team title.

"We'll have to produce to win," he said. "We're going to have to excel at each spot, and if we do that, we'll be in the thick of things at the end."

Three freshmen have stepped in to take over three singles positions. One of those freshmen, No. 5 singles player Chris Nielsen, will not be making the trip because of a wrist injury, but Mike Garcia and Andy Davis will be playing in their first collegiate team match.

"This will be a good tournament to test the new freshmen," McDermott said. "This weekend will give me a good idea of how team-oriented the freshmen actually are."

The winner of this weekend's tournament will compete in the national team championships in February at Louisville, Ky. This weekend's tournament is Nebraska's last competition until spring.

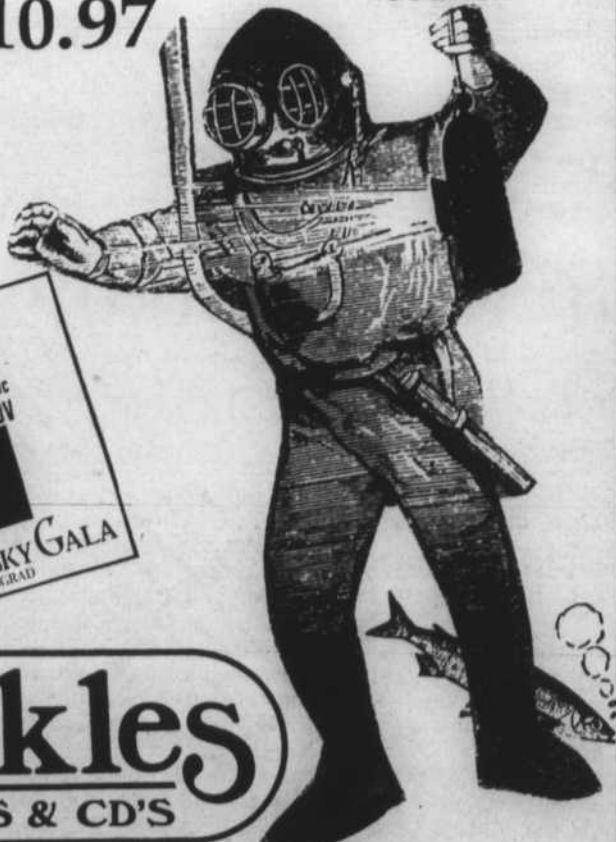
