

Nitchie, a 1990 graduate from Lincoln Southeast, will be playing in Nebraska for the first time since leading his team to the Class A state championship game two years ago against Omaha Creighton Prep. Nitchie said he has been looking

forward to this week's contest against the Cornhuskers
