

Huskers to play Texas A&M home-and-away in 1997, 1998

Nebraska Athletic Director Bob Devaney announced Tuesday that Nebraska has signed a two-year contract to play Texas A&M in football in the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

Devaney said the Cornhuskers and Aggies will play in Lincoln on Sept. 27, 1997. Nebraska will make its first-

ever visit to 72,000-seat Kyle Field in College Station, Texas, on Sept. 26, 1998.

Nebraska and Texas A&M have met six times, most recently in the 1988 Kickoff Classic at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J. The Huskers won that game, 23-14, and lead the series, 5-1. The other five games were played in Lincoln.
