This weekend in the Temple Building, Theatrix presents "Broken Boughs," directed by Layne Ehlers.

"Boughs" is a single production of two one-act plays: "27 Wagons Full of Cotton," written by Tennessee Williams and "Waiting on the Rocket," written by K. Scott Kolb, a University of Nebraska-Lincoln student.

"Wagons" is a dark play about crazy, mean Southern hicks, a sort of "Green Acres" gone to hell. It's a show with everything: sex, violence and violent sex.

Williams fans already will know the story of rough men and delicate, fainting women. Actually, the entire cast of "Wagons" is comprised of two men and one woman.
