## uincentennial chance to heal, activist says

The quincentennial anniversary of Christopher Columbus' landing in the New World should be made an opportunity for oppressed groups to heal, a union official and liberal activist said Thursday evening.

Dolores Huerta, a founding member and first vice president of the United Farm Workers of America, spoke in the Nebraska Union as part of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's observance of Chicano Awareness Week.

Huerta, active in the labor movement since 1962, spoke of both her nous groups they encountered.

experiences and her hopes to a crowd of about 80 people.

Huerta said that Oct. 10, the date

set aside to observe Columbus' landing on Hispaniola in 1492, should be marked at UNL by discussing the plight of Hispanics, Native Americans, African-Americans, Asian-Americans and others who have suffered under the influence of European culture brought to the Americas.

In addition, she said, people need to know about the atrocities Columbus and others inflicted on the indige-

"The reason (to discuss the atrocities) isn't that we want to dwell or reflect on these things; it's that people don't know about it," she said.

Huerta said that because European culture historically relegated women to be men's personal property, women had suffered along with minority ethnic and racial groups.

Women and minorities need to reach out and work to gain a larger voice in politics and society, she said.

Pointing to comparative levels of defense and social program spending, as well as treatment of farm workers in California and other states, Huerta said many decisions made by state and national government were

Government will continue making wrong decisions, Huerta said, until women and minorities are represented in Congress in proportion to their

percentage of the general population.

Huerta, whose union has led a
boycott of California table grapes sprayed with toxic pesticides, said racist or sexist jokes in their presence. the nation.


a group called Feminist Majority, which is working to get women on the ballot for political office in California, Washington, Arizona and possibly Colorado.
