Page 10 Reggae band to make return trip to Linco

If you are into reggae and you ever wanted to say that you saw a band before they made the big time, then take time out this Thursday, Friday or Saturday to check out Les Exodus at Rockin' Robin, 1435 O St.

Les Exodus, a five-piece reggae act, based in Minneapolis, returns to Lincoln this weekend after two sensational and well-received performances last month.

The band was formed in May 1990 by Innocent Galinoma and his longtime friend Onesmo Kibira - both of whom are from Tanzania, in East

rent band. of opening for top world reggae acts, such as Ziggy Marley, Judy Mowatt, Sugar Minott and Mikey Dread, and has carned a solid reputation from extensive touring of the Midwestern United States.

The music of Les Exodus, according to lead singer/guitarist Innocent, is largely influenced by Bob Marley, both in form and content.

"Bob opened a lot of doors," Inno-cent said. "We want to keep doing what Bob was doing and keep roots reggae going.
