"You can't tighten the belt indefi-nitely," he said. "At some point, you tighten it so hard there's no circulation.

The university faces four sets of cuts - three actual and one possible, Spanier said.

Over the last year, he said, the university had to absorb about \$4 million in cuts, and another \$2.2 million in reductions was targeted during the Nebraska Legislature's special session in September.

Also, Spanier said, some legislators have proposed additional cuts for the two-year period beginning July 1,

1993, and ending June 30, 1995.

State Sen. Scott Moore of Seward, chairman of the Legislature's Appropriations Committee, said last week that higher institutions and programs in Nebraska could be hit with acrossthe-board cuts of as much as 10 percent during the next two years.

Spanier said he doubted that the figure would reach 10 percent, "but we have to be prepared for anything."

He said there had been no specific discussion of the possibility of tuition increases, and that such increases would not be decided until May or
