mimicked those on her albums. However, she threw in enough variations to make the show fresh and fun.

The most notable of these deviations happened during the rocker, "Must Be Crazy for Me."

Etheridge and her four bandmates performed a drum interlude—that's right, five musicians, 10 drumsticks and one set of drums—and it sounded great.

And as if that weren't amazing enough, they then took their drumsticks and played them on the strings of Kevin McCormick's bass guitar

while he played the fingerings.

The band did something else that is virtually unheard of among big-name musicians: They played new, unrecorded songs. These included "Yes I Am" and "Change."

Etheridge returned to the stage for two encores, the second of which she performed alone.

During this solo encore, Etheridge played "The Letting Go" on piano by the light of a single fringed lamp that hung above the piano.

It was as though the audience got an intimate glimpse of Etheridge as she might appear during her personal time.

In parting, Etheridge promised to return to Nebraska soon—hopefully, she won't make her fans wait another two years.

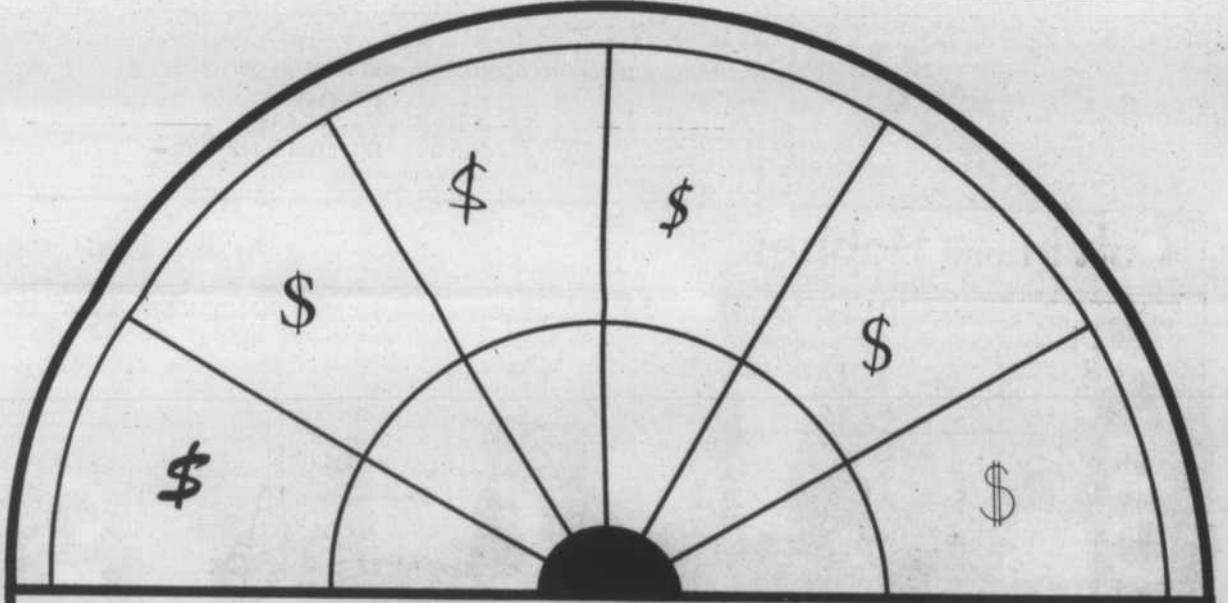

As an additional service and convenience for the students, we are providing a market through the largest national used book company for the books not needed on this campus. The prices paid for these books are determined by the national supply and demand — some books have no resale value.

WHEN TO SELL —
The sooner after each term that you sell your books the better your chance of receiving 50% — because it is at this time of the year that our inventory is most depleted and the time we are receiving orders for the next term. By the time classes of a new term start, we cannot pay 50% because we already stocked the book in adequate quantity.
