## ASUN CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS ELIGIBILITY FOR GRADUATE COLLEGE

The ASUN Constitution states that in order to be eligible for election or appointment to the student government you must be enrolled as a full-time student (Graduate College-9 hours). The proposed amendment would lower the requirement for students in the Graduate College to six hours in a degree-objective program.

ARTICLE V. BRANCHES
B. Eligibility
I. Elected Members. To be e

Elected Members. To be eligible for election to the Senate, a candidate must:

a. Be a regularly enrolled member of the college he proposes to represent and agree in writing to resign if he should terminate his/her enrollment in that college during the term of office for which he seeks election:

b. Be regularly enrolled as a full-time student, either as an undergraduate or as a graduate student.

Be regularly enrolled as a full-time student, either as an undergraduate or as a graduate c. The senator from the Division of Continuing Studies must be enrolled with at least three credit hours.

d. The senator from the Graduate College must be enrolled with at least three credit hours.

e. Meet university regulations for participation in extracurricular activities.

ARTICLE V. BRANCHES

Elibility
Elected Members. To be eligible for election to the Senate, a candidate must:

a. Be a regularly enrolled member of the college he proposes to represent and agree in writing to resign if he should terminate his enrollment in that college during the term of office for which he seeks election.

b. Be regularly enrolled as a full-time student, as an undergraduate student.

c. The senator from the Division of Continuing Studies must be enrolled with at least three credit hours.

d. The senator from the Graduate College must be enrolled in at least six hours in a degree-objective program.

e. Meet university regulations for participation in extracurricular activities.

A vote YES will change the requirement to six (6) hours in a degree-objective program. A vote NO will keep the requirement at 9 hours for graduate students.

ABSENTEE AND DISABLED STUDENT BALLOTS

ABSENTEE BALLOTS. Students who will not be in Lincoln, Nebraska during the time the polls are open will be permitted to vote by absentee ballot. Students who wish to vote by absentee ballot must complete 'Form L' (available from the ASUN Director of Development), between the hours of 9:00 to 5:00 and have their signature notarized and must be cast on or before 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, March 9, 1993.

DISABLED STUDENT BALLOTS. Disabled students to vote. Disabled shall mean unable to attend class due to confinement at the Student Health Center or a hospital. Students so disabled shall call the ASUN Director of Development (472-2581) on or before 12:00 noon of election day, Wednesday, March 10, 1993, and arrangements will be made for voting.
