However, one day when he was out on a leisurely ride, Baldwin said, he came within 8 inches of colliding with a large oak tree.

'Since then, I've formed a religious attachment to bicycle helmets," Baldwin said. "They're vital if you crash. They make the difference of whether you live or die.'

Linda Rizijs, nursing director at the University Health Center, said

very few students who came into the injuries in 1991. center for treatment for bicycle injurics wore helmets.

"I've only seen one case where a man being treated for bike injuries had a helmet," Rizijs said. Most of the injured bikers who go

to the health center are not suffering from head injuries, she said.

"However, there is always a good possibility of sustaining one if a person does not wear a helmet."

Jill Heins, injury prevention coordinator for the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department, said 635 Lancaster County residents sought hospital care as a result of bicycle

'In this county, 20 percent of the bicycle injuries were diagnosed as open head wounds," Heins said.

Bicycle helmets can reduce head injuries by up to 95 percent and the risk of brain injury by almost 90 percent, she said.

Heins said that because of the risk associated with helmetless riding, the Lincoln-Lancaster County Injury Prevention Coalition decided to sponsor the Keep A Head, Wear A Helmet

The campaign, which began Wednesday, will run through June,


