Story of love-hate relationship charming, funny on big screen



'Antonia and Jane'

"Antonia and Jane," a warm, funny, sexy oasis of a film, offers refuge for anyone wanting an escape from end-of-the-semester malaise.

Jane (Imelda Staunton), disc jockey for a retirement home, has always taken what life dishes out without complaint. Jane falls for a man who only gets aroused when she reads Iris Murdoch (an author she detests) aloud.

She puts up with a retiree who wants to set her up with his nephew (as soon as he gets out of prison), a retired woman who forces her to eat food she hates and an overbearing mother.

Above all, Jane puts up with the gorgeous Antonia (Saskia Reeves), who has abused their friendship since childhood. (She once started a secret club and wouldn't let Jane in.) Every year the two meet for dinner, and each encounter leaves Jane feeling inadequate.

We soon find out that Antonia's life is no bowl of cherries, either. Jane thinks Antonia is worshiped for her beauty (Antonia marries Jane's boyfriend out from under her), but Antonia admires Jane's creative spirit and has always felt unexciting by comparison.

"Antonia and Jane" is a better film than "Used People" (both were directed by Beeban Kidron), with more laughs and credible, endearing characters.

Nick Park's "Creature Comforts," a hysterical animated short featuring deadpan documentary-style interviews with zoo animals, will also be shown. This award-winning short is worth the price of admission alone.

These films, the last in the UPC International Film series, will be shown Sunday only at the Mary Riepma Ross Film Theater. Screenings are at 3, 5, 7 and 9 p.m.
