Dana College didn't even have any political scientists, he said. But Hibbing continued with his education there and began student teaching.

After student teaching, Hibbing said he decided he didn't want to be a high school teacher. Although he admires high school teachers, especially since his wife is one, he said he couldn't handle that job.

Being a high school teacher is tough, Hibbing said, because they get students when they are still so impressionable, and the teacher must spend a lot of time on discipline.

Hibbing said he wanted to concentrate more on substance, so he went to graduate school at the University of Iowa.

Hibbing was successful at his research, Humes said, because Hibbing was careful and he "saw to the heart of the situation."


Hibbing doesn't go off on a tangent, Humes said. He sticks to the main question.
